KEY STAGE 2 - KNIFE CRIME TALK

Our Key Stage 2 children welcomed two PCSOs on Wednesday, who spoke about knife crime, personal safety and online awareness.

They helped pupils understand why some people may carry knives and explained clearly that it is illegal to carry a knife or any sharp object. Children were reminded that carrying a weapon is dangerous and can lead to serious injury, including harm to themselves.

The key safety message was:

- Leave the area and tell an adult or call the police if they feel unsafe

The session also covered online safety, reminding children to report or block anything that worries them, including using safety features on apps like Snapchat.

A valuable session helping children make safe, responsible choices.

SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

Water Safety

As we move into warmer weather and spend more time outdoors, it's important to remind children how to stay safe around water.

Drowning can happen quickly and silently, even in shallow water. In the UK, over 200 people lose their lives each year in accidental water-related incidents.

The risk increases in hot weather. When temperatures reach 25°C or higher, drowning risk can be up to five times greater, with significantly more incidents as people head to water to cool off.

For children, this is especially important. Drowning incidents rise in the summer months, when children are more likely to be near water.

🚦 Key messages for children:

- Always be supervised by an adult near water
- Never go near water alone
- If someone is in trouble, tell an adult – don't jump in

Whenever you are around water:

STOP AND THINK

Take time to assess your surroundings. Look for the dangers and always research local signs and advice.

STAY TOGETHER

When around water always go with friends or family. Swim at a lifeguarded venue.

In an emergency:

CALL 999

If you are at the coast, call 999 and ask for the Coastguard. Don't enter the water to rescue.

FLOAT

Fall in or become tired - stay calm, float on your back and call for help. Throw something that floats to somebody that has fallen in.
